We strive to enable young people to maximise their potential during their time with us at PA High Sixth Form. Our whole school values of 'Service, Integrity and Excellence' aim to develop polite, well-rounded and resilient young people who, through hard work and determination, make excellent progress.

We believe that academic success is crucial in enabling young people to go on and access further education or employment at the end of Year 13. That is why we place a strong emphasis on excellent teaching and learning for all sixth form learners, which is supported by a robust study programme. All students have regular timetabled study periods to enable them to consolidate and develop their learning.

We know that being future-ready is about more than just academic success however, we have a strong commitment to providing young people with the opportunity to develop themselves as people. We have a strong student programme and enrichment programme, which both equip students with practical and soft skills to enable them to transition to adulthood. In particular, we will focus on creative thinking, problem solving, financial management and building resilience. This is further enhanced by regular careers events and visits to universities.

FACILITIES

This is a once in a life time opportunity to attend a brand new state of the art sixth form with lessons taught in large, bright classrooms with specialist facilities.

Sixth form students will have a study room where they can work quietly during study periods and at other times of the day. There is also a common room planned for students to relax in at break and lunchtimes as well as during free periods of time.

Our students also enjoy a specialist sixth form service providing a selection of food, snacks and hot and cold drinks, at break and lunchtime.



STUDENT SUPPORT

The student support system is a fundamental part of the experience at PA High; we take the personal development and welfare of our students very seriously. We have a team of student support staff in the sixth form who will oversee attendance and any pastoral concerns relating to students. We will support students where they are able or signpost to other colleagues or services where they deem this to be more appropriate.

We know that there are times when students need additional support and so we offer the following:

- A dedicated sixth form tutor
- A team of wellbeing ambassadors

THE PERSONAL TUTOR

Every student has their own tutor who they meet on a daily basis. Tutors are the first port of call for any worries for students, but they also deliver their Personal, Social Health Education (PSHE) programme and act as academic mentors.

SIXTH FORM BURSARY

The 16-19 bursary is available to provide students with financial support in the Sixth Form. Discretionary bursaries are also available to support with a range of needs, such as; food, transport, school clothing, educational resources and trips. Additionally, eligible students may also be entitled to a vulnerable bursary. Full details can be found on the Sixth Form section of the school website.

DRESS CODE

In consultation with students, we have made the decision that PA High Sixth Form dress code will be that all students wear smart black attire. This can include a jacket but that is optional, and students may prefer to wear a jumper or smart cardigan instead. The expectation is that students will wear black shoes not trainers. CURRICULUM

ADVANCED LEVEL COURSES

A Level courses are studied over two years and examined at the end of Year 13, though some courses also contain an element of coursework to develop independent research.

Entry Requirements

Three A Level Study Programmes:

- a minimum of 5 GCSEs at grades 9-4, including Maths and English for all courses.
- a GCSE grade 5 or better in the courses opted for (5-5 in Combined Sciences GCSE if one or more of the A Level options are Sciences).

Any applicant will also need to meet the requirements for the specific subjects/courses they wish to study.

GOLD DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD

The Duke of Edinburgh Gold Award will be a central part of the extracurricular offer here at PA High Sixth Form. The Duke of Edinburgh's Award is a personalised and non-competitive achievement programme for young people which was started in 1956 by HRH The Duke of Edinburgh.

Students begin their Gold Award in Year 12 and complete it with their Qualifying expedition after their exams in the summer of Year 13.

The programme aims to teach essential skills and attributes for work and life, such as resilience, problem-solving, team-working, communication and drive, enhancing CVS and university and job applications. It is also a recognised mark of achievement, respected by employers. The DofE is many things to many people, supporting generations to successfully navigate life.

Beyond your academic achievements, universities want to see evidence of “soft skills” that you have developed through extra-curricular activities, such as communication, commitment, leadership and teamwork. Your DofE Award is a fantastic way to demonstrate and evidence these skills in practice.
